As you well know VOLUNTEERING is the backbone for American Italian Heritage Society and it's members.




LA FESTA ITALIANA

Sebastian Anthony "Subby" Anzaldo, Sr. was born August 3, 1933 in Omaha from Carlentini, Sicilian immigrants Antonino & Lucia Anzaldo. Janice (Kipp) Anzaldo was born October 9, 1936 in Odebolt, IA to Ade & Ruth Kipp before moving to the big city of Omaha at only 17. Exactly 1 year later, they met when Janice walked into Patton Music on Farnam (to purchase a 45rpm record player) only to be greeted by Subby, the salesman.

Several weeks later Janice and best friend Neva went to see The Eddy Haddad Orchestra at The Music Box and where she was certain "I had seen that horn player before".

Subby, Janice (and Neva) went to midnight breakfast then home, where they talked for hours. That night, she knew she would marry him. They were married at St. Peter's Catholic Church on January 21, 1956. Subby, Jr was born 2/11/57, Tim was born 2/21/59, Twins Terry & Tony were born 1/7/62 and Daughter Gia was born 7/4/65.
