We pray all our members stay well and look forward to your camaraderie once this outbreak is over.

MARCH MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

The general membership meeting, held on March 9, 2020, was called to order by President Terry Bolamperti and was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance with veterans Lou Buda and Tom Clark as flag-bearers. There were over 29 members in attendance. Members were asked to take a moment of silence to remember all of our members that are ill. Special prayers were requested for our AIHS Secretary, Diana Cotten who has had some recent health issues.

The minutes of last month's meeting were read and approved. The **Treasurers Report** was given by President Terry Bolamperti, which was approved by members. He mentioned more rental revenue is needed but bookings are filling in well now that spring is here.

Old Business was discussed including the **Carnevale** which was held and hosted at Pasta Amore Ristorante on Tuesday February 25, 2020. Chuck Caniglia played the part of the Bishop of Carnevale and the packed house enjoyed a delicious antipasti, meal and dessert prepared by chef Leo Fascianella. New Business discussed included the **Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser on** March 15th. Volunteers stepped forward to help for mixing the meatball mixture and rolling and baking of the meatballs.

It was discussed that we may have changes due to the coronavirus spread that has been in

the news in the last few weeks. Our Easter **Sausage Fundraiser** is planned on Saturday April 4th. Volunteers will be needed on Thursday and Friday April 2nd and 3rd and on Saturday April 4th. **Cooking classes** were discussed and may be held in the fall.

A revision of our original cookbook "**A Taste of Italy**" is in the works and being chaired by members Toni Bac, George Grillo and Ann Marie Falco-Marr.

John Portera and Gino Crisafulli gave a brief presentation on the status of **LB 848 on** which the Nebraska Legislative voted to share Columbus Day with Indigenous People Day. The American Italian Heritage Society was strongly against this bill and members are encouraged to contact their State Senators to voice their opinion. The Sons of Italy, Santa Lucia Committee and the Knights of Columbus are also opposed to this change.

The meeting was adjourned and Piece of the Pie winners selected were Lou Buda and Terry Clark. After the meeting camaraderie was shared and pizza served by Wayne Moore was enjoyed by all.

EASTER SAUSAGE FUNDRAISER DETAILS

The spring sausage sale will be **Saturday, April 4, with pick-up from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.** There will be a **drive-thru pick-up only** due to the coronavirus. Someone will be outside directing traffic. There will be one location for payment and a second stop to receive your sausage. You will stay inside your vehicle. If you ordered sausage and don't feel comfortable picking it up, consider asking a relative or friend to pick it up for you.



There is a limited amount of sausage available. There will be regular and hot sausage available in bulk or cased, peppers, olives and a limited amount of meatballs and spaghetti sauce.

Sausage: \$28 / 5 pounds Peppers: \$14 / quart Olives: \$12 / quart

SPAGHETTI DINNER REPORT

The Spaghetti Dinner was held on March 15, 2020 at the Palazzo. Due to the early stages of the coronavirus news the Board of Directors decided to take precautions and hold the dinner as "Takeout Only or Carryout Only" with shortened hours from noon until 4:00 pm. We cancelled the bake sale, the bar and the planned St Joseph's Day Traditional Table.

All necessary recommended precautions were taken by our members who volunteered for this fundraiser. All surfaces were sanitized before and after use and guests came in one door and out another with minimal contact with others. Dinners and salads and bread were served to order and placed in takeout containers and bagged before handed to guests as they exited. Society food specialties of salad dressing and frozen meatballs and sausage were also sold.

All food preparation and filling of takeout orders was done in the kitchen. Volunteers in the foyer/gallery sold product to guests and handed them the bagged takeout dinners. All volunteers washed hands frequently and wore gloves. All touched surfaces were sanitized throughout the day.

200 dinners were sold and many Society food specialties were purchased. We served and collected about 20-25% of what we would do on a "normal" spaghetti dinner. Despite the circumstances we were very pleased with the outcome and the results of this fundraiser.

I want to thank the members and guests that supported our Spaghetti Dinner fundraiser. Thanks also to Rotella's Italian Bakery for donating the bread for the event. Special and sincere appreciation is extended once again to our dedicated volunteers that offered their service on the day of the fundraiser and to all those that helped in any way with all the food preparation in the weeks preceding the dinner.
