#### May 2021 Membership Meeting Report

The General Membership Meeting, held on MAY 10, 2021, was called to order by President Terry Bolamperti and was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance with veterans Ross Pisci and Jim Caniglia as flag-bearers. Both were Korean War Veterans and Ross was also a veteran of World War II. There were 22 members in attendance. Members were asked to take a moment of silence to remember all of our members that are ill including Diana Cotten, Ted Bolamperti, Lou Buda, Cookie Mascarello-Ladwig, Pat Rodino and Maria Leo and for deceased longtime member, Camilla Seminara, the mother of member John Seminara.

We welcomed members Ross Pisci, Sal Belfiore and Mary Ann and Salvatrice Sofio present at the meeting. Ross Pisci, longtime member since 1983, will be 95 years old on May 27th. His father from Carlentini and his mother from Messina, Sicily immigrated to Omaha in 1906. He lived and grew-up on 16th and Dorcas St. He said he loved being a member of the Society and always volunteered where needed. For years he helped with sausage making and ran the Seafood booth at the Festa at Peony Park. He relished his memories of running the Dinner Dances and helping Gene Marchello with the food preparations at the old Hall on 14th and Pine St. Sal Belfiore, visiting from Surprise, Arizona told us about his grandparents (the Belfiore, Fanciullo and Carlentini families) who immigrated to Omaha in the early 1900's. His Nanna Fanciullo ran a grocery store on 13th and Center St and his Nanno Belfiore's house was near 6th and Williams St. Mary Ann and Salvatrice Sofio, attending their first membership meeting, have volunteered in food preparation for the last couple years. Their uncle was Dr. Anthony Sofio, a downtown dentist that served a majority of the Omaha Italians in the 1930's, 40's and 50's. Their grandparents, the Sofio, Salerno and Caniglia families immigrated from Carlentini and Catania, Sicily. Their father Sonny Sofio and their brother ran a liquor store on 19th and Missouri Ave and a bar on 10th and Hickory St. All the above stories were entertaining to those members in attendance.

The **Treasurers Report** was given by President Terry Bolamperti, which was approved by members. He mentioned that wedding receptions will be this month and after since Covid restrictions have eased-up. **Old Business** discussed was the **Pasta Dinner** held on April 25th which was a big success. Thanks to all that helped in any way in this Drive-thru event. **New Business** discussed included the upcoming **Festa Pizza Fundraiser** which will be held on the Saturday June 5, 2021 from 9:00-11:00 am. Volunteers will be needed for preparation of the pizza sauce, cheese grating pizza making and delivery to customers in the Drive-Thru. The annual **Membership Summer Picnic** will be cancelled due to Covid restrictions. We hope to resume this Membership Picnic and the Epiphany Celebration soon as Covid restrictions ease up. The **Festa** was discussed, and the plan is to proceed with the Festa on Labor Day Weekend. Festa Captains will be contacted this month. Festa food prep will be done July July and August. We will have **Sausage Fundraiser** on June 26th. The AIHS Membership **Drive** is resuming as dues statements will be mailed or emailed to all members in May. All were asked to enroll a new member and send in dues promptly.

The **Presentation of the Omaha/Carlentini Sister City Project** was then given by Shari Kanger, Charlie Venditte, Todd Procoppio, Carmelita De La Guardia and Al Vacanti. This project enhancing Italian heritage will be promoted by the Santa Lucia Festival Committee, the Sons of Italy and the American Italian Heritage Society. There will be exchanges between the two cities. Members of each city will visit each other. Some from Carlentini will visit during the Santa Lucia Festival this July. Exchange students from Carlentini and Omaha will study abroad in their Sister City. Local sports events will be shared, respectively. Exchanges of history, foods and ideas are also planned to be shared. This process is in its early stages and more information will emerge as the project expands and grows. The AIHS wishes success to this project and the presenters were thanked for a well-done introduction of this venture.

The meeting was adjourned, and the Piece of the Pie winners drawn were Ross Pisci and John Portera. After the meeting members enjoyed camaraderie and pizza cooked by Larry Belfiore. We welcome all to the next Membership Meeting which will be held on Monday, June 14, 2021.

## **Apple Torte**

pg 163 A Taste of Italy

Frances Saitta Oglesby

2 c. diced apples 1/2 tsp. salt 1 c. chopped nuts 1 tsp. cinnamon 1 c. flour 1 tsp. vanilla

2/3 c. sugar 3 T. butter

1 tsp. baking soda whip cream

Put all dry ingredients in a bowl; add apples and all but a handful of nuts. Add melted butter and vanilla; toss until well mixed. Place in 7x11 inch pan or pie pan. Bake 350 for 20 minutes. Layer with whipped cream, top with remaining nuts. On the ingredients list, vanilla and whip cream were omitted in the cookbook.
