Carnevale in Venice Italy

Since the 5th century, the people maximized the opportunity during last days before the beginning of the Lent to amuse themselves and savor the pleasures and joy of life. In **1094** carnival was already mentioned in a charter of the doge Faliero and in **1269** the Senate approved that they should designate the day before Lent as a holiday (Martedì Grasso-Fat Tuesday).

Carnevale is celebrated in Italy and many places around the world the weekends before the beginning of Lent with a final party/holiday Fat Tuesday. The name is said to derive from the words carne vale - 'farewell to meat'.

This year in Venice, Carnevale begins Sat Feb 12th and concludes Tuesday March 1st. Every day there are multiple events including treasure hunts, concerts, dances, balls, dinners, opera, dance lessons, gondola rides. Guests can rent costumes and attend mask making workshops or take tours of Venice.

Member Spotlight: Energy, Precision, Passion Define Dr. Ted

While Dr. Ted Bolamperti doesn't like to talk about himself, he lights up when he's asked to talk about the American Italian Heritage Society and La Festa Italiana.

Ted or Dr. Ted, as many call him, is one of the founders of the Society, which will be celebrating a landmark this year at a 40th Anniversary Gala at the Society's event venue the II Palazzo on March 12.

For everybody who knows Ted, he is energetic with a capital "E." He is precise in everything he does. He is very dedicated to anything he pursues. The Society and the Festa Italiana are two of his passions and they have been for 40 years.

The AIHS and the Festa Italiana have been a family affair for Ted's large family since the beginning. He has served in many roles over the years, including president and chairman of the board. He served as Festa chair of a separate festival committee until about seven years ago.

His wife Jeaniene, also a founder, helped start (and has been very involved) in the folkdance group. She's organized many special events, dinners, wine tastings and cooking lessons, and for years coordinated the baking of the pastries--biscotti, cannoli, etc.-- for the Festa. High school sweet hearts, Ted and Jeaniene will be married this year for 61 years. They have seven children, 21 grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Their adult children and spouses and now their grandchildren all are involved and typically work at every Festa as well as other events. Their son Teddy Bolamperti has served on the board of directors and also as chair, their daughter Lisa Garrett just completed a term as chair of the board and now his grandson Joe Garrett has been elected to the board.




Member Spotlight: Energy, Precision, Passion Define Dr. Ted continued


He had been going strong, but in 2019 still practicing full-time dentistry at the age of 78, he had a stroke. The stroke felled him but not for long. Like everything he does, he went at his rehabilitation with a fervor. Today, he exercises and does physical therapy daily to improve his strength. He retired from his dentistry practice in 2020 but still teaches two days a week at Creighton's School of Dentistry where he has worked (in addition to his dental practice) for

54 years.

Besides his rehabilitation and work at Creighton, he dedicates many hours to the Society doing a variety of activities. Currently he is involved in fund raising activities, ordering food supplies and paper products, and other necessary tasks. For the Festa he secures the refrigeration units for outdoor use, arranges the fork lift for set-up and take down, and prepares most of the sauces, including primavera, marinara, peppers, scampi and chicken Sicilian. He also prepares the spices for the sausage, determines the amount of food needed, perfected the recipes for the spaghetti sauce and the filling for the







Asked what he is most proud of on a personal and a professional level, he responded that he is proud of his family, from Jeaniene to their adult children and grandchildren, and appreciates how they have stood behind him and supported him. He is also proud of his faith, his dentistry and professional relationships, and all of the friends who gave him so much joy and help in his career and building the Society.

Looking back over 40 years, he praised the founders. "They were enthusiastic, loved what they were doing, were confident and highly committed. That's what made us strong. It wasn't me. It was those people." He also thanked the first members of the society – the charter members – who gave the founders the desire to move forward.

"Success is the result of one's hard work, competent people around you and diligent planning," he added.

Roasted Peppers

2-3 diced garlic cloves

1 12-16 oz can whole tomatoes

10 red bell peppers

Salt & pepper to taste

1 T crushed red pepper (optional)

2 T olive oil

1 tsp. sweet basil

Wash and dry peppers. Set on cookie sheet and place in oven set to broil. Turn peppers as they blacken. When all peppers are black, steam in paper bag. Cool, then remove skin and cut up, removing stem and seeds. Heat oil in frying pan and sauté garlic. Mash tomatoes in a bowl and add to hot oil. Salt, pepper and sweet basil are added next. Cook until tomatoes become thick. Add peppers to tomato sauce, adding salt and pepper to your taste then cook for 15 minutes more.

In 1981 our Society was founded with 118 Charter Members. Our American Italian Heritage Society was officially granted its "Articles of Incorporation" as a non-profit organization from the State of Nebraska in November of 1981. The members of the Society have worked relentlessly for these past years to promote and preserve our Italian heritage and culture. Congratulations to all past and present members for their efforts to make our Society a success for an amazing 40 years.

We have accomplished so much in these years that seemed like it flew by. We have held 37 successful Festa Italiana's, the signature event of our Society and our most profitable fundraiser. We have held food experiences dinners, game feeds, spaghetti dinners, Carnevale festivities, Wine tasting experiences, cooking classes, Italian language classes, folk dancing lessons, genealogy programs, Easter egg hunts for children and many more events. We are a very active Society. We have made our special homemade sausage 3 times a year for all these years as a major fundraiser for the Society. The Society has offered complimentary dinners to its members in the promotion of The Epiphany Celebrations, the membership Summer Picnics and St Joseph Day Celebrations.

We are proud to announce that we have awarded over \$110,000.00 in AIHS Scholarships to children of members over the past 40 years. The monthly membership meeting's offer occasional informative programs, updates and reports of all Society events and most importantly warm camaraderie among members.

In 1982 we bought our original "home" on 14th and Pine Street. It served us very well for over 20 plus years. We sold it and bought 8 ½ acres of land on 132nd and Fort St. We were homeless for 9 years, with our equipment in storage at Pompeii and all meetings were held at Pasta Amore Ristorante, with fundraising held there and at various Catholic churches.

In 2010 a Capital Campaign was initiated to help defray costs for plans for our new home. Architectural plans were drawn and approved by the Omaha Planning Board and the Omaha City Council. Vacanti & Randazzo Companies broke ground for the new home in 2013. In August of 2014 the building was completed and we had the grand opening and ribbon cutting of our new home, "il Palazzo". All operations of the Society are now held at the Palazzo. The facility is also available for weddings, corporate events, holiday gatherings and many other events to help with building costs.

We thank all our members that volunteered their precious time and efforts which helped make our Society a success. Many of our members have passed away that were so dear to us in our early years. There are many current elderly members that used to do so much to help our Society stay strong and vital. The current members that carry on with enthusiastic service and efforts perpetuate the success of the Society. The younger members that attend and volunteer at our events are the future of the Society.

We are a busy and active Society with a lot of accomplishments in the past. The State of the Society is strong and vital after 40 years of success, we have a great future to look forward to. Sincere thanks and gratitude is extended to all deceased and current members.
