# Cucuzza Soup by Leo Fascianella

1 Large Cucuzza (peel and remove seeds) 1 potato

1 white onion Cut all into small

1/2 stalk celery cubes

4 tomatoes 4 cups Chicken Stock

Saute onion with olive oil, add tomato and let cook 5 min, add celery, potato and cucuzza, let simmer for 15 min. Add chicken stock let cook for 20 min. Salt & Pepper to taste, serve with ditalini pasta or another small pasta. Top with olive oil and romano cheese.

#### ITALIAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

is celebrated by proclamation of the President of the United States to honor the achievements and contributions of Italian immigrants and their descendants living in the Unites States, particularly in the arts, science, and culture. Events are held throughout the month of October celebrating and educating the public about Italian American history and culture. October is designated as Italian heritage Month to coincide with Columbus Day which is celebrated on the second Monday in October.

\*\*Celebrate and share Italian heritage with music, movies, worship, food, geology or history\*\*

**Columbus Day** is to honor an Italian navigator **Christopher Columbus** from Genoa, Italy who discovered the new World we know as America. On the 400th anniversary of Columbus' first voyage, Columbus Day was declared a one-time national holiday, in an effort to soothe tensions with Italian Americans and between Italy and America.

## Carlentini - Sister City

Omaha Mayor Stothert and the Mayor of Carlentini, Italy, Giuseppe Stefio participated in a virtual signing ceremony of the Sister City Friendship agreement September 22nd.



Over the past year, three Italian heritage organizations in Omaha - the American Italian Heritage Society, the Santa Lucia Festival committee and the Orders of the Sons and Daughters of Italy, helped lay the groundwork for this agreement. They formed the Sicula Italia Foundation, a nonprofit whose mission is to bring these two cities together.

This friendship agreement with Carlentini, Sicily provides an opportunity for cultural education and business partnerships and recognizes the century-old connections between the two cities and a history of family, faith, culture and tradition.

Omaha has a rich Italian presence which makes up the fourthlargest ethnic group in the city. More than two-thirds of Omaha's Italian population actually descended from Carlentini immigrants. Italians worked for the railroad and settled in "Little Italy", where they established many businesses.
