Jim Canigilia Memorial

We were saddened with the news that we lost another dedicated member of the Society. James F. Canigilia died on September 6, 2023, at 90 years of age. He was known as "Jimmy" by close friends. Jimmy Caniglia was a long-time member, and he contributed his talents to the Society in many ways. He was active in many of the first Festas in the early 1980's. He was a food salesman and was very good in the kitchen as a cook. Jimmy volunteered for many events for the Society. He always helped make meatballs with the meatball crew. He was chairman of several spaghetti dinners and worked most of them when he was younger. He helped cook for food experiences and wine tasting events put on at the Palazzo. He volunteered to do food demonstrations at the Festa many times. Last year in 2022, he was scheduled for a food demo at the Festa.

He was traveling in Italy and could not get out of the country on time due to Covid restrictions. He called and offered to do the demo via Skype electronically over the internet from Italy, but connections didn't allow it. He also volunteered at the Deli at the Festa. He was always so helpful and a pro in the kitchen. Jimmy was always eager and happy to share his expertise with cooking and preparing food with others. Jim also served on the AIHS Board of Directors and was a donor to the Capital Campaign. Jim Caniglia was also very active in the Santa Lucia and the Sons of Italy. He was a good man, and we will miss him dearly as a dedicate and enthusiastic member of the Society. Please keep "Jimmy Caniglia," his wife Pam and family in your thoughts and prayers.

A nice gathering of Festa folks were on hand to cheer on the celebrities.

Saturday night Bocce centered around open play for Festa guests to try their skill at the Italian Bowling Game. Many first-time players were guided through the rules and shown the proper technique by AIHS member Barrett Williams, a young and experienced Bocce player who was assisting as a volunteer. A good time was had by all participants with many often returning throughout the night.

Sunday evening featured an Italian three team challenge. The Sons and Daughters of Italy, the Santa Lucia Society and the American Italian Heritage Society participated. Before the challenge began Lou Buda presided over the opening of the event by rolling the ceremonial first ball. Lou, a long-time member of the AIHS and honored volunteer, has held many valued leadership positions. He along with other leaders within the AIHS are the reason we have our beautiful home to host the La Festa Italiana. Lou's only request for the match was there would be no cussing unless it was in Italian.

The challenge started at 5:00pm and went until dark. Excellent Bocce skills were on display from all three teams throughout the evening. A large gathering of spectators surrounded the court as skillful play was appreciated and applauded. Always a great time to have the three Omaha Italian groups getting together for some Bocce competition and comradery.

3 c. pumpkin, diced

- 2 T. butter

3 c. milk

Parsley for garnish

Mix water, pumpkin, sugar and butter; cook slowly until very tender, adding more water if necessary. Remove from heat and press through a sieve or use a processor. Add milk and bring to boiling point. Blend and add salt to taste. Reheat and serve with crostini or croutons.
