Reservations are necessary to know how much food to prepare. And how many children under 12 for gift bags.



EGGPLANT SICILIAN (Caponata)

Lou Turco

2 med. Eggplants

6 c. celery hearts (cubed)

2 c. fresh onion (cubed)

1 c. olive oil

3 lg. fresh tomatoes

2 c. sliced mushrooms, canned or fresh

2 c. sliced pimento stuffed green olives

1 lg. garlic clove, cut in half

2 qt. boiling water

salt & pepper to taste

Cut eggplant into 1-inch slices and remove skin. Cut slices into 4 to 6 pieces depending on size of slice. Cooking in moderate heat, sauté eggplant in 1/2 cup olive oil until half cooked, then add cubed tomato. In separate pan using the remaining oil, cook until half done the celery, onions, mushrooms, green olives and garlic. Combine with the eggplant and tomato. Continue cooking for an additional 5 minutes on low heat to incorporate flavors. Add salt and pepper to taste; cool. Cover and store in refrigerator for 24 hours.

This was presented at the December 14, 2022 General Membership Meeting. It has been an extremely busy year for the Society with our scheduled fundraisers, meetings and events. Our membership has a home that we can all be proud of which will fulfill the needs of the Society and serve the needs for future generations. Our leadership and volunteers have been very active making the Society a success. Our mission of promoting, encouraging and preserving our Italian heritage and culture has been somewhat hindered and impeded this year again due to post-Covid restrictions and continual Covid flare-ups. We've done the best we could and stayed very busy throughout the year. Our accomplishments include:

- General Membership Monthly Meetings were held.
- The Celebration of Epiphany, normally held January, was cancelled due to a spike in Covid.
- The Carnevale was successfully celebrated in February at Pasta Amore.

- The Italian Christmas Italian Cookie Exchange was enjoyed by all at the Dec Membership Meeting.

- The Society had our property, building and land, rezoned to Mixed Use after two years of negotiations with the City of Omaha's Planning Board and the City Council.

 testament to the pride, will and efforts of the Italians of the Omaha community and the selfless and dedicated

The Sausage Sale Fundraiser that was held on December 9, 2023 was a huge success. Thanks to the many volunteers who made this event a Big success




