#### CONGRATULATIONS TO SOCIETY MEMBER LOU ROTELLA JR. 2019 INDUCTEE INTO THE NEBRASKA BUSINESS HALL OF FAME

We are very proud to announce that Society member Lou Rotella Jr. of Rotella's Italian Bakery Inc., has been inducted into the Nebraska Business Hall of Fame on February 7, 2019. Lou was selected for this honor by the Nebraska Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Selections were based on the inductees integrity, strength in ethics, innovations in industry and of course business success. Lou Rotella Jr., CEO and president of Rotella's Italian Bakery has devoted his career to product innovation and business development, propelling the family business from a local legend to a national leader. The Bakery began in Italy in 1850 and came to Omaha in the early 1900's. Lou's grandfather, Alessandro Rotella and his wife Maria Concetta opened a small bakery on 22nd and Pierce Street in



Omaha in 1921 and delivered bread with a horse drawn wagon. Lou's father, Louis Rotella Sr., came into the business in 1947 and oversaw the 1989 opening of the 108th and Harrison facility in La Vista, which combined cutting edge technology with old world techniques. The fifth generation of Rotella's now sells more than 500 products through five states and also markets their products for wholesale across the country. Our Society wishes to congratulate Lou and Kathi Rotella and family for their success in transforming a small local Italian business into a national leader in the bakery business. With all the business success, Lou Rotella has still retained his down-to-earth demeanor and strong close-knit relationships with family and neighborhood friends.
