

Also welcomed were members Sal and Cheryl Belfiore who were in town from Surprise, Arizona. They are here visiting family for Christmas. Sal has helped this past week with the sausage fundraiser. Both families were warmly received.

The minutes of last month's meeting were read and approved. The Treasurers Report was given by President Terry Bolamperti, which was approved by members.

Old business was discussed including last month's Board election results with John Portera and Joe Garrett as new Board members. The Festa was briefly discussed with a few bills yet to be paid. Last months Spaghetti Dinner was also discussed and the Sausage Fundraiser held this previous weekend was discussed and all that volunteered to help in any way were sincerely thanked.



Our leadership and volunteers have been very active making the Society a success. Our mission of promoting, encouraging and preserving our Italian heritage and culture has been somewhat hindered and impeded this year due to Covid restrictions and protocols. We've done the best we could and stayed very busy throughout the year. Our accomplishments include:



- General Membership Monthly Meetings were held but several were cancelled due to Covid.

- In July and August food preparation was done for the Festa.

- The Festa Italiana was held successfully on Labor Day weekend.
- New Board Members, Joe Garrett and John Portera were elected at the Nov Membership Meeting.
- The Italian Christmas Italian Cookie Exchange was enjoyed by all at the Dec Membership Meeting.
- The Dan Polley-Lou Buda Awards for the 2013, 2020 and 2021 Men and Women of the Year were awarded to Steve and Carolyn LaGreca, Larry and Deana Belfiore and Dawn Abboud and Tom Clark respectively at the April Membership Meeting.

Our building and home, the Palazzo, will be a focus of Italian activity for generations to come. The Palazzo is a testament to the pride, will and efforts of the Italians of the Omaha community. This was the 7th year in our new home. We have been hit hard with many cancellations of weddings and events due to Covid this year. Risotto

1 med onion, diced

3 stalks celery, diced

1 clove garlic, minced

1 & 1/2 sticks butter

2 qt. chicken broth

Taste of Italy pg. 227 by Jeaniene Bolamperti

2 c Water Maid long grain rice or Arborio

3-4 pieces chicken livers (gizzards, heart) diced

2 T. tomato paste (optional)

1 T. salt

1/2 tsp. pepper



Sauté onion, celery and garlic in melted butter. Add rice and cook for 3-4 minutes at medium heat, stirring frequently. Add finely chopped chicken livers & gizzards. Add 1 qt of chicken broth and tomato paste if desired. Stir well. Cook until rice is done, adding more broth as needed to cook rice to desired texture.

Grains of rice swell and grow as they cook, in many cultures representing abundance and wealth. Accordingly, in northern Italy, especially Piedmont, Friuli and Lombardy, it is customary to serve a New Year's Eve first course of risotto to encourage prosperity in the coming year.
