October 2022 Membership Meeting Report

The General Membership Meeting was called to order on October 11, 2022 by President Terry Bolamperti and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance with veterans Lou Buda and Tom Clark as flag-bearers. There were 26 members in attendance. Members were welcomed and many Festa Captains were in attendance. The minutes of last month's meeting were read and approved by members. The Treasure's Report was given by Terry Bolamperti and approved by the membership. Old business discussed was the Festa Italiana. It was a record Festa for the amount of food sales and for revenue taken in. A detailed Festa report was given discussing booth revenues and all aspects of the event. As booth totals were reported, the Captain of each booth was individually thanked and applauded for a job well done. Festa chairman Terry Bolamperti once again thanked all volunteers that helped in any way making this record Festa a huge success. All were wished a happy Columbus Day. New business was discussed on this night of Columbus Day which including a short presentation by John Portera honoring Christopher Columbus on the holiday commemorating his Discovery of America. John reviewed the article he wrote that was published in the World Herald on Sunday. Terry reported that the Sons of Italy held a very successful Columbus Day Banquet at their hall awarding scholarships to several very qualified students. She announced that the Sicula Italia Foundation will have a Gala Celebration on Friday December 9, 2022 at the downtown Doubletree Hotel. Many signed up to help at the meeting. It was also announced that Society specialty food items will be sold at the Pasta Dinner including meatballs, sauce and salad dressing. We will also be selling Italian pastries and select Festa T-shirts and sweatshirts. It was also announced that Board elections will be held at next month's membership meeting. Nominees' bios will be in the November Newsletter.

The meeting was adjourned and the Piece of the Pie winner were Joe Garrett and Rose Leo Koch. Members were offered a selection of freshly picked tomatoes and peppers from Dr. Terry's garden to take home. After the meeting members enjoyed camaraderie along with a dish of crumbled sausage and peppers prepared and served by Larry Belfiore. 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Lentil Soup Page 28 A Taste of Italy Connie Romano

1 lb. lentils

4 quarts Water

2 smoked ham hocks

2 c. chopped celery

1 c. chopped celery leaves

2 T. Mrs. Dash seasoning

1 garlic clove

1 c. tomatoes, seeds strained out

2 red potatoes, peeled & quarted

1/8 c. or less Italian seasoning mix


1 c. chopped onion



Wash ham hocks in running water. Place 2 quarts water into a Dutch Oven. Add ham hocks then remaining ingredients except lentils and potatoes. Simmer over medium to low heat for 2 hours. Wash lentils, removing any dirt or small rocks. Add potatoes and lentils to ham hock mixture. Cook approximately 2 more hours over medium to low heat. Serve as a soup or over noodles or dumplings.
