The figures of this imposing masterpiece have an almost sculptural description derived from the artist's study of the work of the sculptor Jacopo della Quercia. The sky, which now appears almost black, would originally have been lighter in color. Pietro de' Lardi, who commissioned this important work, became deputy general to Borso d'Este, duke of Ferrara, in 1452. According to the long inscription, it was painted sometime between 1400 and 1431, when Pietro Boiardi was bishop of Ferrara. ## **Almond Pizzelles**

3 eggs1 3/4 cups flour1 tablespoon almond extract1/2 cup butter or margarine


Beat eggs and sugar. Add cooled melted butter or margarine and almond extract. Sift flour and baking powder and add to egg mixture. Add finely chopped almonds. Batter will be stiff enough to be dropped by spoon. Plug in the pizzelle iron and once the indicator light is turned off, the pizzelle iron is ready to go. Drop one heaping teaspoon of batter in the center of each grid pattern. Baking will take approximately 30 seconds per pizzelle. Pizzelle irons will vary. Remove pizzelles from the grid with a butter knife. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.

#### Memories of a Giving and Loved Member - Rosario "Ross" Pisci

He was tireless in this effort by promoting activities, searching for new ideas- a visionary and commanding these programs such as the monthly dinner dances. When it appeared that activities were slowing he let everyone know of such and strongly voiced his concern and got busy to improve more activities. He was known as the "bunny" in the ever ready battery commercial beating the drum "he keeps on going and going and going."

He served on the board and eventually became chairman showing leadership, courage, knowledge in advancing the mission of the society. He achieved the full support of the board and membership. He put together programs with the enthusiasm of everyone. His entire family and his friends not only took part in these activities but also in La Festa



where he chaired the seafood booth for many years and he and Jean were part of the folk dance group and his family also took part. Being part of the many activities of the folk dance productions and chairing a booth was no easy task – Ross made it fun for all.

If anyone could be the volunteer member of this year, year after year, it would be Ross!

Ross mastered his leadership quality, courage and self respect by serving as a combat marine in World War II and the Korean War. The only telling sign of that was his wearing of that veteran's cap. He built his own home for Jean and his three children – gifted he was in many ways. He retired after 20 years as a City of Omaha Building Inspector leaving as Chief Plans Examiner.

Of all the joys of his life, he has told me time and time again "the time spent with the society in the growing past 20 years were some of the best years of mine and Jean's life." I was proud to be part of that experience!

My personal relationship with Ross, brought me the conclusion that he was man of trust, maximum integrity, humble, virtuous, intelligent, kind, giving, committed, honorable and loving.

I will always cherish his loyalty to my efforts in pursuing the mission of the society by engaging members to become leaders of the various communities and encourage members to be a part of these.
