Free to Paid Members and guests welcome.


Guests/ \$10 donation recommended.






### The Mission Statement of the American Italian Heritage Society

### **Basic Pesto Sauce**

2 cups fresh basil leaves, lightly packed & thoroughly washed & dried1 cup grated Parmesan Cheese1/2 cup olive oil1 to 2 garlic cloves, minced

Place all ingredients except garlic into a food processor or blender until finely chopped. Pesto can be used immediately or put in small jars in the refrigerator or freezer. Pesto will keep in refrigerator for approximately 1 week. If longer storage is desired, freeze. A thin layer of olive oil in jar will keep the pesto from darkening. Makes approximately 1 1/3 cups pesto sauce. **Garlic**: If pesto is to be used immediately, add 1 or 2 cloves of minced garlic. Otherwise add to pesto as it is used because garlic flavor strengthens as it is stored; it will overpower the flavor of the basil. **To Serve**: Toss 4 cups of hot, cooked and drained spaghetti, fettuccine or other pasta gently with 6 tablespoons to pesto and 4 tablespoons of softened butter or margarine. Add 1 cup of favorite Italian grated cheese; toss gently. Serve with additional pesto and cheese to suit individual tastes.

- The Festa Italiana was held successfully on Labor Day weekend.
- A very successful 38th annual Festa Italiana was held Labor Day Weekend at the Palazzo.
- New Board Members April Belfiore, Courtney Dice, Nick Bolamperti & Sal Belfiore were elected in November.
- The Italian Christmas Italian Cookie Exchange was enjoyed by all at the Dec Membership Meeting.
- The Dan Polley-Lou Buda Awards for the 2022 Man and Woman of the Year were awarded to Salvatore and Giovanna Risicato at the December Membership Meeting.
- The Society had our property, building and land, rezoned to Mixed Use after two years of negotiations with the City of Omaha's Planning Board and the City Council.
- Our building and home, the Palazzo, will be a focus of Italian activity for generations to come. The Palazzo is a
  testament to the pride, will and efforts of the Italians of the Omaha community and the selfless and dedicated
  efforts and services of the members of the Society. This was the 8th year in our new home.




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### Memorial to Lou Marcuzzo
